

Speaker George MacLeod from Macleod Family Vineyard

George first talked to our Rotary Club three years ago and is still as sharp as he was then. George and his wife and two children bought the property for the new Macleod Family wines in1974. They harvested their first grape crop in 1979.

He knew very little about growing grapes so picked Mr. Kunde's brains as much as possible to help him get started. He is very enamored by a book written 500 years ago on growing grapes and that is as relevant today as it was then.

Terroir is a French word which means soil or land. You have to see, taste, feel, and smell the land to know what happened to it in the past. Listen to the land regarding its composition, relation to the sun, hillside or flat, rain gathering,

Three ways to love the land: Are Love, Love, and affection. He is the elder statesman of the wine industry in the Valley of The Moon. After clearing the land of rocks, he found out that the grapes don't care about rocks; the roots just grow around the rocks!

He has written a book called "The Land Remembers" which you can buy for \$15.00 at their ranch.
