THIS WEEKS SPEAKER

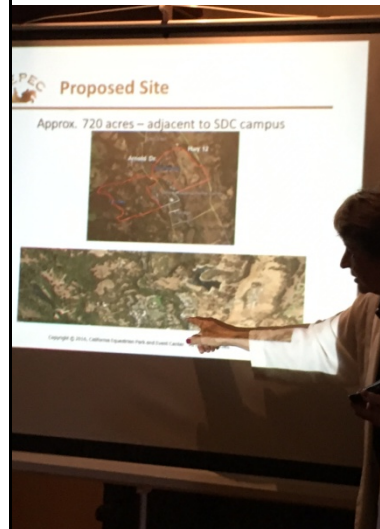


Wanda Smith is the executive director of CEPEC (California Equestrian Park and Event Center) a proposed Equestrian Park & Event Center to be built in Glen Ellen near the Sonoma Development Center on Arnold Drive.

CEPAC is a non-profit organization who will be developing a world class equestrian complex. The idea is based

on the input of over 1,000 community members and organizations.

Horses bring in more dollars to Sonoma County the grape and wine industry!



People want safe trails, a vet hospital, a practice and show facility, boarding facilities, and conditioning facilities for the horses. Sonoma County once had 6 race tracks and the biggest horse shows on the west coast.

CEPAC will have facilities for barrel racers, dressage, show jumping, polo, driving, and gymkhana.

They estimate that the project will generate \$250,000,000 in annual revenue. They will have 90 full time and 250 part time jobs. There is no international horse center west of Kentucky.

Less than one half of parks in Sonoma County allow trail riding. Access would be from Highway 12.
